



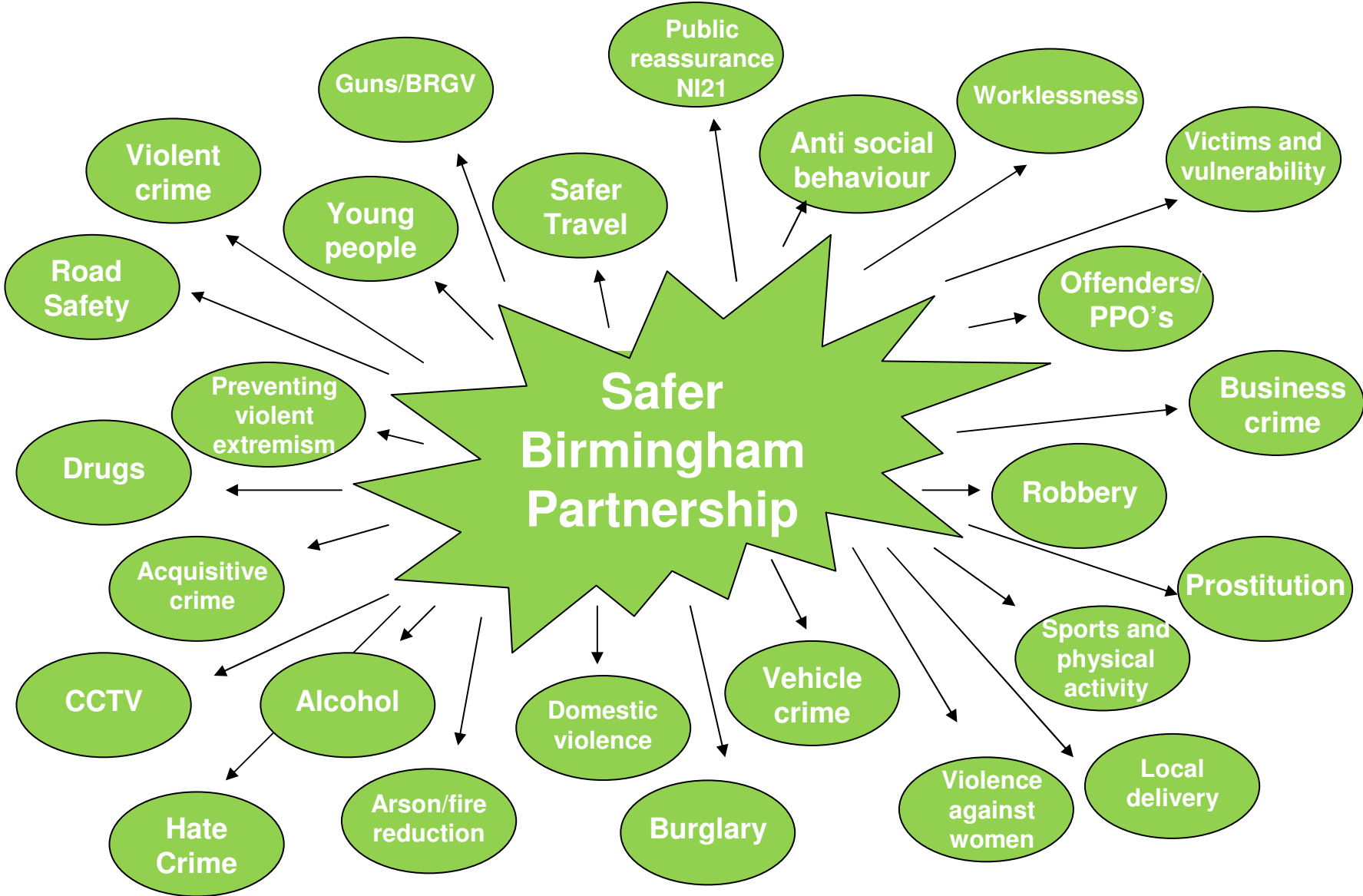

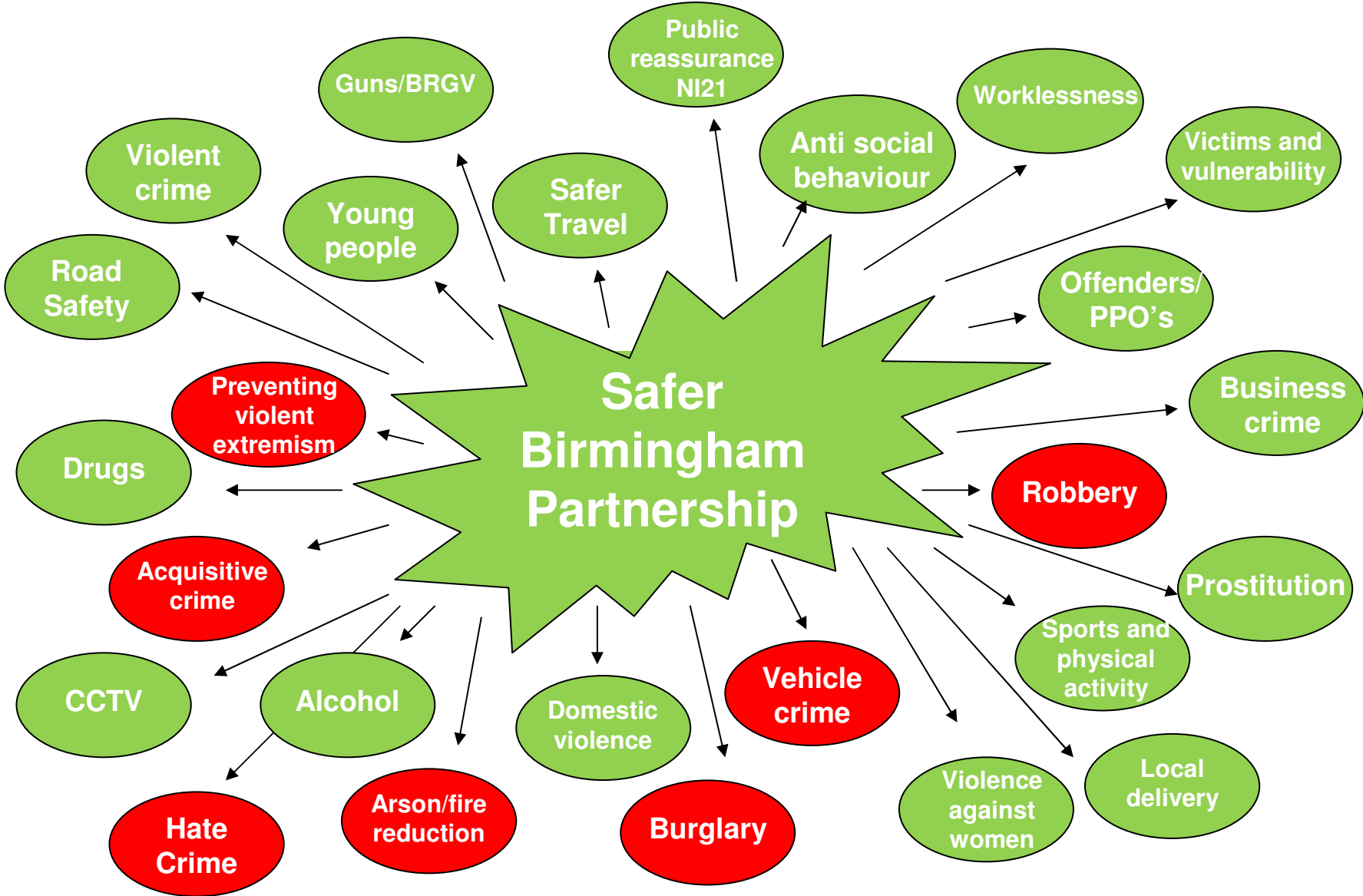

Priorities

- Guns and Gangs x3
- Broaden agenda from just a crime focus – poverty, worklessness; health, environment
- Community cohesion x3
- Closures of day centres for elderly/ young adults/ learning disabilities/ mental health
- The modernisation structure of adult and communities and NHS
- Housing for disabled people is not adequate
- Strategic discussion on Drugs, PVE, Safer Travel, Public Reassurance, ASB and Acquisitive crime
- Local vehicle crime
- Working together to intervene in various cycles at the right point – effective early intervention around family issues, addictions, criminal behaviour
- Hate crime x2
- Drugs agenda within the inner city
- Mental health problems and crime
- Community safety coordination
- Anti-social behaviour x2
- Community partnership
- Community tension monitoring
- Bridge building
- Increasing diversity
- Young people
- Alcohol and drugs x3

Priorities (cont)

- Third sector involvement in local delivery groups x2
- Graffiti
- Fly tipping and environmental degradation x2
- TSA - promote cooperation between membership to public sector for limited funds
- Drug dealing x2
- BRGV
- N I 21 - understanding of what public want, what we do and linking this up together.
- To increase public confidence in the criminal justice system in relation to sexual violence/ abuse local and strategic
- National targets are not lined up with local needs for those taking/ using/regardless of substance
- Protection of all survivors needs and rights – not just those who report and are included in police statistics
- Access to healthcare as a result of domestic violence, violent crime, guns, drugs, alcohol.
- Sexual violence and abuse – against women, men girls and boys in the city (strategic and local)
- Encouraging partnership working between statutory and voluntary agencies
- To acknowledge the differences between sexual violence/ abuse and domestic violence/ abuse not just the similarities and overlaps
- Mainstreaming housing needs of vulnerable persons on a strategic agenda
- To educate the public about sexual violence/ abuse – from an early age and challenge the myths!
- Social inclusion
- Lack of joined up services



Other concerns/ issues

- There appears to be an over representation of police in chair – open it up
- Funding – knowing where it is and how to access this!
- Third Sector Assembly – promote cooperation between members
- Where does the current funding go – how much to third sector?
- Showcase the third sector to give evidence
- How does the DAAT work? Especially with young people and families?
- Not sure why ‘worklessness’ is this in the main stream?
- I would like Third Sector agencies to agree the agendas and buy into them – e.g. Safer Birmingham Partnership
- I am concerned that the Safer Birmingham Partnership agenda is set by recorded crime figures – for sexual abuse most survivors do not report and their needs may be excluded.
- For me it is about knowing who your partners are – what they can do for you and how quickly.



Other concerns/ issues (cont)

- I want the community safety managers to introduce themselves
- I want clear direction of how my organisation can join the local delivery groups. If we don't have the capacity to join all which should we focus on?
- Third Sector Assembly resources/ skills/ info to engage with public sector
- Third Sector Assembly - consult and engage more on the ground
- Recognise champions - they need to be skilled and not just pushing their own agenda - need passion
- Good communication between Third Sector representatives and NHS providers. Timely approach to communication
- Training and support provided for champions to be able to represent through the community
- They would serve to join up our work to or at least allow us to start the conversation
- Third Sector Assembly - publish the third sector organisations working around these themes
- Communication, meetings, e-bulletins - it is up to the third sector how we engage e.g. social media
- Third Sector working groups around themes as well as areas.
- Identify cycles that are negative around these themes and consider joined up intervention where it would be most effective
